Don't post anything you wouldn't share with your parents or children. That's a good rule of thumb when you need clarification on whether what you're about to post is inappropriate.

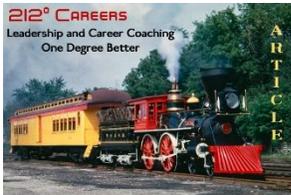
## **Ditch the Curse Words**
