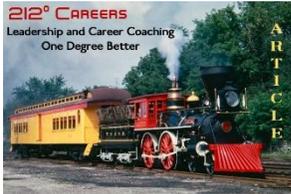

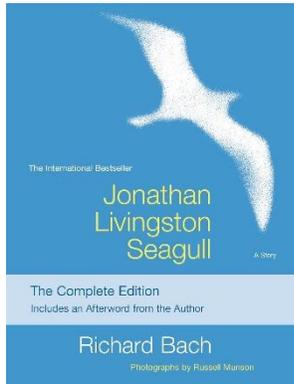
2. Set a Learning Goal for the Next 7 Days
